Jens Liengard Hjorth has been appointed Adjunct Professor of Tropospheric Chemistry at the Department of Environmental Science, Aarhus University, as of 1 May 2017.

The scientific work of Jens Hjorth is focused on air pollution and atmospheric chemistry, particularly in relation to ozone and particles in the troposphere. Initially he was mainly involved in laboratory studies of chemical reactions relevant to atmospheric chemistry and in simulation experiments where atmospheric chemical processes were simulated in chambers. In the latest years, he has been carrying out field studies, particularly regarding measurements of ship emissions and on their impact on atmospheric chemistry in the marine environment.

He became 'cand. scient' In chemistry and physics at the University in Copenhagen in 1982. Four years later, he obtained a PhD from the University of Odense and started working at the Joint Research Centre of the European Commission in Ispra in Northern Italy where he remained until his retirement in 2016.
